Privacy Policy

What is this privacy policy for?

This privacy policy is for our website www.cheethamadvice.org.uk and served by Cheetham Hill Advice Centre and governs the privacy of its users who choose to use it. The policy sets out the different areas where user privacy is concerned and outlines the obligations & requirements of the users, the website and website owners. Furthermore the way this website processes, stores and protects user data and information will also be detailed within this policy.

Who are we?

We are Cheetham Hill Advice Centre. We are committed to protecting your personal information and making every effort to ensure that your personal information is processed in a fair, open and transparent manner.

We are a "data controller" for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998 and (from 25 May 2018) the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 ("Data Protection Law"). This means that we are responsible for, and control the processing of, your personal information.

How we collect information about you

Everything we do, we do to ensure that we can provide advice that people find useful and helpful. We want to make sure you receive the communications that are most relevant to you, be it through visiting our website or receiving emails. We want to make sure you receive the best attention when you use a service, volunteer or make a donation.

We collect information from you in the following ways

When you interact with us directly: This could be if you ask us about our activities, register with us for training or an event, make a donation to us, ask a question, apply for a job or volunteering opportunity or otherwise provide us with your personal information. This includes when you phone us, visit our website, or get in touch through the post, on social media or in person.

When you interact with us through partners or suppliers working on our behalf

This could be if you access a service, which is delivered through a trusted organisation working on our behalf and in partnership with us.

When you interact with us through third parties

This could be if you provide a donation through a third party such as Just Giving or one of the other third parties that we work with and provide your consent for your personal information to be shared with us.

When you visit our website

We gather general information, which might include which pages you visit most often and which services, events or information is of most interest to you. We may also track which pages you visit when you click on links in emails from us. We also use "cookies" to help our site run effectively. There are more details below – see 'Use of Cookies'.

We use this information to personalise the way our website is presented when you visit to make improvements and to ensure we provide the best service and experience for you. Wherever possible we use anonymous information, which does not identify individual visitors to our website.

From other information that is available to the public: In order to tailor our communications with you to your background and interests we may collect information about you from publicly available sources or through third party subscription services or service providers.

Information we collect and why we use it

Personal Information

Personal information we collect includes details such as your name, date of birth, email address, postal address, telephone number and credit/debit card details (if you are making a purchase or donation), as well as information you provide in any communications between us. You will have given us this information whilst making a donation, registering for an event, placing an order or any of the other ways to interact with us.

We will mainly use this information:

- To process your donations or other payments, to claim Gift Aid on your donations and verify any financial transactions.
- To provide the services or goods that you have requested.
- To update you with important administrative messages about your donation, an event or services or goods you have requested.
- To comply with the Charities (Protection and Social Investment) Act 2016 and follow
 the recommendations of the official regulator of charities, the Charity Commission,
 which require us to identify and verify the identity of supporters who make major
 gifts so we can assess any risks associated with accepting their donations.
- To keep a record of your relationship with us.
- Where you volunteer with us, to administer the volunteering arrangement.

If you do not provide this information, we will not be able to process your donation, sign you up for a particular event or provide goods and services you have requested.

We may also use your personal information:

- To contact you about our work and how you can support Cheetham Hill Advice Centre (see section on 'Marketing' below for further information).
- To invite you to participate in surveys or research.

Sensitive Personal Information

If you share your personal experience or the experiences of a friend or relative, we may also collect this information. If you provide us with any Sensitive Personal Information by telephone, email or by other means, we will treat that information with extra care and confidentiality and always in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

You can of course decide if you want to remain anonymous in a case study, if you are happy to share your personal details with staff members or if you would like us to share your story with the media or other parties as part of our work telling people's personal stories about advice (for example, on our blog).

A special note about the Sensitive Personal Information we hold

Data Protection Law recognises that some categories of personal information are more sensitive. Sensitive Personal Information can include information about a person's health, race, ethnic origin, political opinions, gender, sex life, sexual orientation or religious beliefs.

We will only use this information:

- For the purposes of dealing with your enquiry, training, and quality monitoring or evaluating the services we provide.
- We will not pass on your details to anyone else without your express permission
 except in exceptional circumstances. Examples of this might include anyone
 reporting serious self-harm or posing a threat to others or children contacting us
 and sharing serious issues such as physical abuse or exploitation.
- Where you have given us your express consent or otherwise clearly indicated to us (for example, by submitting your story through our 'Your Stories' website page) that you are happy for us to share your story, then we may publish it on our blog or in other media.

Legal basis for using your information

In some cases, we will only use your personal information where we have your consent or because we need to use it in order to fulfil a contract with you (for example, when you have signed up to our training).

However, there are other lawful reasons that allow us to process your personal information and one of those is called 'legitimate interests'. This means that the reason that we are processing information is because there is a legitimate interest for Cheetham Hill Advice Centre to process your information to help us to achieve our mission of providing advice in Manchester.

Whenever we process your Personal Information under the 'legitimate interest' lawful basis we make sure that we take into account your rights and interests and will not process your personal information if we feel that there is an imbalance. Some examples of where we have a legitimate interest to process your Personal information are when we use your personal information for data analytics, conducting research to better understand who our supporters are, improving our services, for our legal purposes (for example, dealing with advice, complaints and claims), or for complying with guidance from the Charity Commission.

Sharing your Information

The personal information we collect about you will mainly be used by our staff (and volunteers) at Cheetham Hill Advice Centre so that they can advise you. We will never sell or share your personal information with organisations so that they can contact you for any marketing activities. Nor do we sell any information about your web browsing activity.

Cheetham Hill Advice Centre may however share your information with our trusted partners and suppliers who work with us on or on our behalf to deliver our services, but processing of this information is always carried out under our instruction. We make sure that they store the data securely, delete it when they no longer need it and never use it for any other purposes. Some examples of where we may share your information are with our fulfilment partners who help to create and send information to you to reduce our costs or with our partners who help us to process donations and claim Gift Aid.

We enter into contracts with these service providers that require them to comply with Data Protection Laws and ensure that they have appropriate controls in place to secure your information.

Cheetham Hill Advice Centre is an independent Charity working with partner organisations to deliver advice across the city of Manchester. On occasions we will share your personal information with partner organisations that we are contracted to work with to ensure that we are able to provide their services effectively.

Legal disclosure

We may disclose your information if required to do so under the terms of our confidentiality policy or by law (for example, to comply with applicable laws, regulations and codes of practice or in response to a valid request from a competent authority); or, in order to enforce our terms of service and other agreements.

Keeping your information safe

We take looking after your information very seriously. We've implemented appropriate physical, technical and organisational measures to protect the personal information we have under our control, both on and off-line, from improper access, use, alteration, destruction and loss.

Our paper files are kept in locked filing cabinets, in a locked building that is secured by metal shutters and an intruder alarm system.

Unfortunately, the transmission of information using the internet is not completely secure. Although we do our best to protect your personal information sent to us this way, we cannot guarantee the security of data transmitted to our site and to email.

Our websites may contain links to other sites. While we try to link only to sites that share our high standards and respect for privacy, we are not responsible for the content or the privacy practices employed by other sites. Please be aware that advertisers or Web sites that have links on our site may collect personally identifiable information about you. This privacy statement does not cover the information practices of those websites or advertisers.

How long we hold your information for

We only keep it as long as is reasonable and necessary for the relevant activity, which may be to fulfil statutory obligations (for example, advice quality standards, the collection of Gift Aid).

Your rights

You have various rights in respect of the personal information we hold about you – these are set out in more detail below. You can also make a complaint to the data protection supervisory authority, the Information Commissioner's Office - https://ico.org.uk or call their helpline on 0303 123 1113.

- Access to your personal information: You have the right to request access to a
 copy of the personal information that we hold about you, along with information on
 what personal information we use, why we use it, who we share it with, how long we
 keep it for and whether it has been used for any automated decision making. You
 can make a request for access free of charge. Please make all requests for access
 in writing, and provide us with evidence of your identity.
- Right to object: You can object to our processing of your personal information
 where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is
 something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to
 processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are
 processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes. Please contact
 us as noted above, providing details of your objection.
- **Consent:** If you have given us your consent to use personal information (for example, for marketing), you can withdraw your consent at any time.
- **Rectification:** You can ask us to change or complete any inaccurate or incomplete personal information held about you.
- **Erasure:** You can ask us to delete your personal information where it is no longer necessary for us to use it, you have withdrawn consent, or where we have no lawful basis for keeping it.
- Portability: You can ask us to provide you or a third party with some of the
 personal information that we hold about you in a structured, commonly used,
 electronic form, so it can be easily transferred.
- Restriction: You can ask us to restrict the personal information we use about you
 where you have asked for it to be erased or where you have objected to our use of
 it.
- **No automated-decision making:** Automated decision-making takes place when an electronic system uses personal information to make a decision without human intervention. You have the right not to be subject to automated decisions that will create legal effects or have a similar significant impact on you, unless you have

given us your consent, it is necessary for a contract between you and us or is otherwise permitted by law. You also have certain rights to challenge decisions made about you. We do not currently carry out any automated decision-making.

Please note, some of these rights only apply in certain circumstances and we may not be able to fulfil every request.

Marketing

We will only contact you about our work and how you can support Cheetham Hill Advice Centre by phone, email, or text message if you have agreed for us to contact you in this manner.

You can update your choices or stop us sending you these communications at any time by contacting office@cheethamadvice.org.uk. If you have provided us with your postal address we may send you direct mail about our work unless you have told us that you would prefer not to receive such information.

The Website

Our website and its owners take a proactive approach to user privacy and ensure the necessary steps are taken to protect the privacy of its users throughout their visiting experience. This website complies to all UK national laws and requirements for user privacy.

Use of cookies

Our website uses cookies to better the users experience while visiting the website. Where applicable our website uses a cookie control system allowing the user on their first visit to the website to allow or disallow the use of cookies on their computer / device. This complies with recent legislation requirements for websites to obtain explicit consent from users before leaving behind or reading files such as cookies on a user's computer / device.

Cookies are small files saved to the user's computer's hard drive that track, save and store information about the user's interactions and usage of the website. This allows the website, through its server to provide the users with a tailored experience within this website.

Users are advised that if they wish to deny the use and saving of cookies from this website on to their computers hard drive they should take necessary steps within their web browsers security settings to block all cookies from this website and its external serving vendors. This website uses tracking software to monitor its visitors to better understand how they use it. This software is provided by Google Analytics which uses cookies to track visitor usage. The software will save a cookie to your computer's hard drive in order to track and monitor your engagement and usage of the website, but will not store, save or collect personal information.

Other cookies may be stored to your computer's hard drive by external vendors when this website uses referral programs, sponsored links or adverts. Such cookies are used for conversion and referral tracking and typically expire after 30 days, though some may take longer. No personal information is stored, saved or collected.

Social media platforms

Communication, engagement and actions taken through external social media platforms that this website and its owners participate on are custom to the terms and conditions as well as the privacy policies held with each social media platform respectively.

Users are advised to use social media platforms wisely and communicate / engage upon them with due care and caution in regard to their own privacy and personal details. This website nor its owners will never ask for personal or sensitive information through social media platforms and encourage users wishing to discuss sensitive details to contact them through primary communication channels such as by telephone or email.

This website may use social sharing buttons, which help share web content directly from web pages to the social media platform in question.
